SUMMARY OF MEETING:

The teleconference was held to discuss the proposed requirement for changing table restraints. Task group chair, Andrew Kutyllo, shared the proposed language discussed in the January ASTM task group subcommittee meeting. Shaina recapped the results from CPSC lab testing for both the anchoring integrity tests as well as the retention testing.

Andrew questioned whether the anchoring tabs provided with changing pads would also be tested along with the occupant restraint. Based on what was seen in lab testing, the group decided that the occupant restraint anchor integrity test

would end up also testing changing pad tab anchor integrity (and, thus, the tabs would not also need their own test). The group also discussed in which direction the load should be applied during the retention test (how is the load most likely to be applied by an occupant?) Determined a horizontal sideways pull makes sense since the motion most likely to cause a fall is an occupant rolling off the side.

Task group adjourned prepared to present updated language to the ASTM subcommittee in April.
